Elisabeth Borne submitted her resignation from the government yesterday to Emmanuel Macron who accepted it. Several names are circulating to succeed her, including that of the Minister of Education Gabriel Attal. The announcement of the new head of government is expected very soon.

Temperatures continue to fall. Today will most likely be the coldest day of the week according to Météo France. And in this context, nine departments have been placed under orange snow and ice alert: Isère, Savoie and Haute Savoie are added to Essonne, Yvelines, Eure, Manche, Calvados and Orne. Also note that the alert for a risk of flooding is still in force in the North and Pas de Calais.

And Pas de Calais is awaiting the visit of Christophe Béchu, the Minister of Ecological Transition - A trip to present the measures that the executive intends to implement in the face of the exceptional floods that the department suffered last week. On site, the situation is improving as water levels continue to decline.

Three police officers are tried from today before the Circuit Court of Seine Saint Denis. They appear for the violent arrest of Théo in Aulnay sous Bois in 2017. One of them is being prosecuted for having seriously injured the young man with the blow of a telescopic baton. The main accused faces up to 10 years in prison. The other two up to 7.

The American airline United Airlines indicated yesterday that it had discovered poorly screwed bolts during checks on the condemned doors of its Boeing 737 MAX 9 aircraft. The same as the one torn off during an Alaska Airlines flight last Friday. All these planes are kept on the ground for the duration of an inspection, by order of the American Civil Aviation Agency.

And then the C.E.S in Las Vegas opens its doors today. The traditional technological innovation trade fair hopes to regain its momentum after the down years due to Covid-19. To do this, the show is announcing more than 20,000 new products in its stands. Organizers expect more than 130,000 visitors to line the aisles of the Las Vegas Expo Center. The exhibition will end on Friday.
