"I will carry the cause of France's schools here with me to Matignon". These were the words of the country's new Prime Minister, Gabriel Attal. At only 34 years old, the former Minister of Education is the youngest tenant that the PM's offices at Matignon have seen in the history of the Fifth Republic. He barely had time to be appointed before Gabriel Attal was off to Pas de Calais to drop in on victims of the flooding there. The Prime Minister announced that at least 50 million euros will go towards the reconstruction of public facilities.

As for the rest of the government, the final list of new names and who will be staying put is expected before the end of the week. According to several sources, Gérald Darmanin should remain at the Interior.
