Gabriel Attal was this afternoon in a police station in Val-d'Oise, in Ermont. The new Prime Minister thanked police officers for their daily work. Gabriel Attal was accompanied by the Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin, who is expected to remain in the government.

A 13-year-old student assaulted his technology teacher in class. This happened in the Alpes-Maritimes yesterday. After a remark on his behavior, the boy allegedly threw a chair towards the teacher then overturned a table before hitting him several times. A precautionary exclusion measure was taken pending a disciplinary council. The teacher filed a complaint.

Antony Blinken continues his tour in the Middle East. The head of American diplomacy met today with the President of the Palestinian Authority, Mahmoud Abbas. He reaffirmed that the United States supports tangible measures for the creation of a Palestinian state. Yesterday, Antony Blinken urged Israel to spare civilians in the Gaza Strip, where the bombings are non-stop. According to Hamas, the strikes on Gaza last night caused more than 70 deaths.
