The new government is already at work. After a first Council of Ministers at the end of the morning, the new Minister of Education Amélie Oudéa-Castéra, still in charge of sports, visits the Saint-Exupéry middle school in Andrésy this afternoon, in Yvelines, alongside her predecessor and new Prime Minister Gabriel Attal. Gabriel Attal recalled during the transfer of power that school will remain a priority.

At the same time, Gérald Darmanin, still at the Ministry of the Interior, went to the headquarters of the Raid, in Essonne, to induct the new boss of the elite unit of the National Police.

"I do not want managers, I want revolutionaries". These are the words of Emmanuel Macron during the first Council of Ministers. The Head of State gave the main directions to follow, saying that solidarity and speed are the conditions for efficiency". He repeated that wants results. Emmanuel Macron will speak next week before the declaration of general policy of Gabriel Attal.

Also in the news, more than 6 years after the events, an indictment has been made in the case of Naomi Musenga. The 22-year-old young woman died in Strasbourg after calling the Samu for severe stomach pain. The operator, who did not take the alert seriously, has just been indicted for failure to assist a person in danger.

The images are impressive: A bus lying on its side, on a railway track. The vehicle fell around ten meters lower, in LeVens, near Nice. Two teenagers who were seriously injured have been hospitalized. According to Nice Matin, the driver tested positive for narcotics.

And then many are concerned for Alexis Pinturault. The French skier was the victim of a heavy fall in Wengen, in Switzerland. He lost his balance after the last jump of the Super-G. The Savoyard, triple champion of the world, was evacuated by helicopter to undergo examinations. The Super G was won by the Frenchman Cyprien Sarrazin and was the first victory in this discipline in the World Cup .
