The storm was, in the end, was less "cataclysmic" than what was feared. Cyclone Belal hit the northern and eastern coasts of the Reunion Island hard these past hours. It is now moving away to the south-east. Belal caused at least 2 victims: 1 homeless person in the west of the island and a person swept away by the waves in Mauritius.

Civil security reinforcements, gendarmes and Enedis agents will be sent on site, says the Minister of the Interior, Gérald Darmanin. Nearly 150 people will be deployed as soon as the airport reopens, which is not planned until tomorrow evening.

This evening he brings together the parliamentarians of his majority. Emmanuel Macron will gauge the pulse of his troops before the press conference scheduled for tomorrow. The President will speak at 8:15 p.m., a week after the appointment of his new Prime Minister. He will undoubtedly have to respond to the controversies surrounding the appointment of the Minister of National Education Amélie Oudéa Castéra, who asked today that the "the personal attacks chapter" be closed.

There has been a suspected car attack in Israel, killing one person and injuring twelve others near Tel Aviv. 2 Palestinian suspects from the West Bank, were arrested.

The Dakar mourns the death of a Spanish motorcyclist. Carles Falcon, 45, was the victim of a fall on Sunday. Placed in an artificial coma, he ultimately did not survive his injuries. His team made the announcement this afternoon.
