A 14-year-old teenager was killed yesterday evening in the Paris metro. The boy was stabbed during a fight involving knives at the Basilique metro station on line 13. He died of his injuries despite intervention from the emergency services. No suspects have been arrested.

Another hearing will take place today in the Jubillar case. The public prosecutor's office intends to make a request for additional information in the investigation into the death of Delphine Jubillar. The nurse from Tarn went missing in December 2020. Her body was never found. Her spouse, Cédric Jubillar, will be brought before a criminal court in a few months' time on charges of her murder. His lawyers have appealed this decision.

Police unions are calling for Black Thursday today, encouraging officers to provide only minimal services for the day as they make their demands concerning working conditions during the upcoming Olympic Games. Demonstrations are planned in several cities including Paris, Toulouse, Nantes and Marseille.

Public funding has been temporarily suspended for the Stanislas private school in Paris after Médipart revealed that an inquiry had found that homophobic and sexist abuse took place at the school. The prestigious school in Paris' 6th arrondissement is where the Minister of Education, Amélie Oudea Castera sends her children. The school says that these are false and defamatory accusations.

25 départements from the Paris region to Normandy are on weather alert for snow and ice this morning. Motorists in the Paris region are urged to be especially careful. The maximum speed on main roads in the Paris region has been lowered by 20km/hour as the Paris police chief has activated level 3 of the plan for dealing with snow and ice.
