Police rallies took place in front of police stations today at the call of the Alliance and Unsa-Police unions, who are concerned about the organization of the Olympic Games. They are demanding guarantees during this event which will welcome millions of tourists for several weeks.

The unions, who were received at the beginning of the week by Gérald Darmanin, are expecting an answer from the Minister of the Interior by the end of the month.

Suspended prison sentences were requested against the police officers in the case of Théo. Between three months and three years requested against the three officers. The heaviest sentence targets the police officer responsible for the baton blow which seriously injured the young man seven years ago, during an arrest in Aulnay-sous-Bois.

Tomorrow, roads – and sidewalks- might be slippery. Frosts are expected in Normandy, Hauts-de-France, Ile-de-France and in the North-East. It should be particularly icy in the areas still under the snow. The snow continues to fall this evening in the Massif Central and the Alps. Seven departments are still under orange weather alert, from Cantal to Haute-Savoie via Isère.

Each household must complete the questionnaires distributed by the INSEE.
