Faced with the farmers' outcry, Gabriel Attal receives this evening at 6 p.m. in Matignon the agricultural union FNSEA as well as the *Jeunes Agriculteurs*. The sector is awaiting concrete responses from the Prime Minister in the face of environmental standards, considered too strict and the increase in taxes. Today the farmers continue their movement and continue blocking a portion of the A64 motorway south of Toulouse. This afternoon the Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin assured them that there would be no evacuation.

There are actions south of Toulouse, but also elsewhere in Occitanie: The A62 motorway, west of Montauban, is also blocked, as is the entrance to the Golfech nuclear power plant in Tarn-et-Garonne. Actions also in Agen or south of Perpignan. Farmers are also demonstrating in other European countries, with mobilizations in Germany, Poland, the Netherlands and even Romania.

In the rest of the news, 7 people are tried since this morning in Paris at the trial of the Trèbes and Carcassonne attacks. They are relatives of the attacker Radouane Lakdim, who was killed during the GIGN assault. These attacks killed 4 people, including Lieutenant-Colonel Arnaud Beltrame on March 23, 2018. The trial should last 1 month and end on February 23.

News in the Gérard Depardieu case. The complaint of actress Hélène Darras for sexual assault against the actor was dismissed by the Paris prosecutor's office. The events, dating from 2007 during the filming of the film Disco have expired. There will therefore be no investigation, unless the actress decides to file another complaint with the constitution of a civil party.

And the hiker, who went missing yesterday at the Isola 2000 station in the Alpes-Maritimes, was found dead this morning by the gendarmes. The 52-year-old woman had gone alone on snowshoes yesterday afternoon. Significant resources to find her had been deployed.
