The farmers' movement is gaining momentum. They are taking actions throughout France to denounce the increase in taxes and European standards. Farmers are waiting for concrete responses from the government. Prime Minister Gabriel Attal is speaking right now at Matignon with the *Coordination rurale*. Without strong announcements, the mobilization will not weaken according to Damien Brunelle, president of the *France grandes cultures* union and responsible for major crops for the *Coordination rurale*.

And after *Coordination rurale*, Gabriel Attal will receive the *Confédération paysanne* in a few minutes this evening.

In Pamiers in Ariège, the blockade was lifted following the tragedy this morning, when a farmer was killed, hit by a car. On the social network X Emmanuel Macron expressed his condolences to the protester's relatives.

In the rest of the news, Gérard Larcher is opposed to the inclusion of abortion in the Constitution. The President of the Senate believes that voluntary termination of pregnancy is not threatened in France and that the Constitution "is not a catalog of social and societal rights". The text will be debated in the Assembly tomorrow before being examined by the Senate.

And to finish: "Anatomie d'une chute" arrives in Hollywood. The French feature film by Justine Triet has just been nominated in 5 categories at the Oscars including that for best screenplay, best actress, and best director, as well as the most prestigious award: The Oscar for best film.
