Operations are underway throughout almost the entirety of the country and the movement is expected to grow by the end of the week. Farmers are maintaining pressure on the government to demand urgent measures, which would allow them to make a living from their profession. A mobilization marked by the death yesterday in Ariège of a farmer and her daughter, hit by a car at a blocking in Pamiers. The three occupants are still in police custody. The prosecution announces that it will communicate on the legal consequences of this case during the day.

Today is the 3rd day of hearing at the trial of the Trèbes and Carcassonne attacks. 3 police officers who were present during the terrorist attack carried out in Aude in 2018 are speaking. The hearing was delayed this morning because one of the 7 accused refused to be taken from his cell. On the first day of trial, he did not appear at the hearing; it was the gendarmes who had to bring him in.

Owners could receive up to 240,000 euros for the repurchase of their houses impacted by the floods in Pas de Calais. This is what the Minister of Ecological Transition, Christophe Béchu, announced yesterday after the record floods in November and January in the North of France. The municipalities affected by the second wave, and which had not already been classified as a natural disaster will be today.

Christophe Béchu raises his voice against the SNCF. The Minister of Ecological Transition summons the CEO of the company Jean-Pierre Farandou after the breakdown of the Paris-Clermont train. 700 travelers had remained stranded for part of the night last Friday without heating with freezing temperatures. The line regularly makes the headlines for its repeated breakdowns. This situation can no longer continue, indicates Christophe Béchu, who is asking the SNCF for a plan of concrete and immediate measures.
