Farmers are waiting for concrete answers. The agricultural union, the FNSEA, has just sent a list of 120 demands to Prime Minister Gabriel Attal; they will then be published this evening. The demands relate to income, administrative burdens and the inconsistencies of the European Union. The farmers' union thus hopes to quickly obtain points of agreement as explained by Luc Sméssar, Vice President of the FNSEA.

And the FNSEA asks the government to provide a response by Friday at the latest. Prime Minister Gabriel Attal should make announcements at the end of the week during a trip on site, but also during his speech of general policy, scheduled for next Tuesday in the Assembly.

In the meantime, the actions have intensified today almost everywhere in France. This is the case for example in Agen, where farmers targeted the prefecture of Lot-et-Garonne this evening. A tractor is trying to force the gates of the building.

In the rest of the news, Valentin Marconne is tried since today before the court of the Gard. In the Cévennes, he had shot dead his boss and a work colleague in a sawmill in Plantiers near Alès in May 2021. He then took refuge in the woods for almost 4 days before being arrested. The hearing will last until Monday.

And then soccer: A match has just started in Maubeuge, between Feignies-Aulnoye, a *Nationale* 2 club and Montpellier for the last match of the round of sixteen of the Coupe de France.
