A new stage in the mobilization of farmers: The FDSEA and the *Jeunes Agriculteurs* of Ile-de-France are calling for a blockade of Paris tomorrow from 2 p.m, and this while Prime Minister Gabriel Attal plans to speak to provide answers to this movement - A movement which remains very determined according to the president of the FNSEA Arnaud Rousseau who visited today farmers mobilized in Nitry dans Yonne.

Today, dozens of roads were blocked throughout France. In Agen and Rennes, tractors have taken over the city center, sometimes disposing of manure in front of state buildings or even large supermarkets.

Also in the news: The information came at the end of the afternoon. The Constitutional Council widely censors the immigration law. A total of 32 articles of the text are challenged, including stricter access to social benefits or migratory quotas by Parliament. The Government takes note, indicates Gerald Darmanin, the Minister of the Interior who will speak this evening on TF1 at 8 p.m.

The 7th edition of *Nuit Solidaire* is being held this evening in several municipalities in France. This is a census which makes it possible to quantify the number of people living on the streets and thus help find solutions.

And then a word of soccer: Will Hervé Renard be loaned by France to the Ivory Coast? The coach of the French women's team was supposedly contacted according to the Team to take charge of the Ivorian selection until the end of the African Cup of Nations.
