Farmers are maintaining the pressure while awaiting announcements from Gabriel Attal. The Prime Minister is expected this afternoon in Haute-Garonne to try to respond to the crisis in the agricultural sector.

In the meantime, there are still numerous blockades throughout France. The A7 and the A9 are completely cut off between Isère and Aude. This is an unprecedented situation. And at the same time farmers are heading towards the capital. the FDSEA Île-de-France announces five blockades around Paris from 2 p.m.

Also in the news, vandalized businesses, broken windows and damaged cars. The demonstration against the immigration law degenerated yesterday in Rennes. Several hundred people, mostly masked and hooded, marched in the city center a few hours after the decision of the Constitutional Council, which – as a reminder - part of the text was censored. The government announced last night that it was preparing to promulgate the text in the coming hours.

The International Court of Justice renders its decision today on the accusations of genocide in the Gaza Strip. The highest court of the UN was seized by South Africa which accuses Israel of committing a crime against humanity in the Palestinian enclave. The court which could order the Jewish state to stop its military campaign or facilitate humanitarian aid.

And then a word about handball: France is playing its place in the Euro final this evening against Sweden. *Les bleus* hope to continue their flawless performance even if the challenge promises to be significant against the nation most successful in the history of the competition.
