The head of the FNSEA warns the government less than two weeks before the Agricultural Show that they are not ruling out new blockades. The agricultural union is considering a resumption of actions if concrete efforts are not visible between now and the opening of the largest farm in France on February 24. "We must accelerate the pace", indicates Arnaud Rousseau who will be received tomorrow by Prime Minister Gabriel Attal in the company of Minister of Agriculture Marc Fesneau.

They precisely want to draw inspiration from farmers to obtain concessions in their turn. Liberal nurses are carrying out go-slow operations today around several large cities in France such as Marseille, Bordeaux and Dijon. These health professionals denounce the conditions of grueling work and demand a reevaluation of their actions and urgent measures, otherwise more than one in two practices may close, according to them, within five years.

Also in the news, a tragedy took place in the North. 3 pedestrians died this morning when struck by a car. The victims were struck on a sidewalk outside the village of Stain Becque. A fourth person is in critical condition. According to *la Voix du Nord*, the driver of the vehicle veered off into a bend for a reason that is still unknown. He was taken into custody.

Israel announces that it has freed two Hamas hostages after a nighttime operation in Rafah in the south of the Gaza Strip. These are two people of Israeli and Argentinian nationality were kidnapped from a kibbutz during the attack on October 7. "Only continued military pressure will make it possible to free all the hostages", says Benjamin Netanyahu
