Ilias Akoudad is sentenced to 30 years in prison for the murder of Eric Masson, including 20 years of a security sentence. The police officer was killed almost three years ago in Avignon at a drug sales point. After having denied, the accused finally admitted to having pulled the trigger, but he assured that he did not know that the victim was a police officer. The court finally accepted the aggravating circumstance of murder of a person holding public authority.

An eventful visit for Christophe Béchu and Marc Fesneau at the *Salon de l'Agriculture*. The Minister of Ecological Transition and that of Agriculture were targeted by egg throwing and whistles. Lactalis announces that it has reached an agreement with its suppliers on the price of milk. For the first quarter, the price is set at 425 euros per 1,000 liters, or five euros more than the manufacturer's last proposal. This outcome comes after several weeks of tension.

And today is March 1st, and among the changes worth noting is the entry into force of the Descrozaille law: Promotions beyond 34% are now prohibited for both food and non-food products. The goal is to strengthen the balance between suppliers and distributors. Another change on March 1 is the number of departments in which the RSA is dependent upon 15 hours of activity, which increases from 18 to 47, before the generalization of the measure next year.

Thousands of Russians gathered in Moscow today for the funeral of Alexei Navalny. The opponent of Vladimir Putin died two weeks ago while serving a 19-year prison sentence for extremism. The French, German and American ambassadors were also present. The funeral was supervised by the police to avoid any demonstration. Amnesty International France salutes the courage of the Russians who defied authorities to pay tribute to Alexeï Navalny.
