

Understanding cause and effect in English Grammar

What are cause and effect

cause and effect relationships are often expressed using specific conjunctions or phrases. Common conjunctions include 'because,' 'since,' 'as,' and 'due to,' while phrases like 'as a result,' 'therefore,' and 'consequently' indicate effects. These elements help connect actions or events logically, showing the reason behind an outcome.

Explication in French:

Examples:

Conjunctions:

- **Because:** He failed the exam because he didn't study.
- **Since:** Since it was raining, we stayed indoors.

Phrases:

- **As a result:** The team worked hard, and as a result, they won the match.

Common Mistakes:

When using cause and effect, a common mistake is misplacing the conjunction or phrase, which can lead to confusion in the intended meaning. For instance, using "because" instead of "as a result" in a sentence emphasizing the consequence can alter the message significant:

She couldn't enter the concert because she didn't have a ticket."

Correct: "She couldn't enter the concert as a result of not having a ticket."
