47,000 fans and supporters lined the streets of Paris yesterday to welcome home the conquering heros, Paris Saint Germain. PSG were back from Munich with the Champions' League cup in tow after a stunning 5-0 win against Inter Milan in the final on Saturday. Yesterday, the team was greeted with a parade on the Champs-Élysées followed by a detour to the Salle des Fêtes at the Élysée Palace.

And while the majority of fans celebrated PSG's victory peacefully, Saturday night saw hundreds of arrests, clashes with police and even two deaths. Emmanuel Macron has said that those reponsible will be dealt with, pledging last night that "We will prosecute them, we will punish, we will be relentless."

The Dreyfus affair will be the topic at the Assemblée National today, even though it has been more than 130 years since Alfred Dreyfus was wrongfully convicted of treason. The parliamentary group Ensemble pour la République would like to posthumously elevate Dreyfus to the rank of "général de brigade", a position he would have been in line for had the case not shattered his army career. Ensemble pour la République say that the bill under discussion today sets out to offer "symbolic recognition for an extraordinary case that is unparalleled in the history of the Republic".
